RISSB CODE OF PRACTICE FOR DEFINING RAIL SAFETY WORK

The Rail Industry Safety and Standards Board (RISSB) has produced the first draft of a Code of Practice for Defining Rail Safety Work. This project aims to provide a clear decision-making tool which addresses the lack of practical definition in the National Model Legislation for Rail Safety Work. This Code is based on existing practice of the rail industry at large.
